





Philanthropic Funding for Regions, 2016




Grants may benefit multiple regions and would therefore be counted more than once. As a result, figures add up to more than 100 percent.







Flint Water Crisis Case Study




LeeAnne Walters North American Goldman Environmental Prize Winner 2018

- The Flint water crisis accounted for a large part of funding for manmade accidents in 2016.
- More than half of the funding for reconstruction and recovery in 2016 was related to the Flint water crisis
