- One of the longest named storms in the Atlantic – it became a named storm Aug. 24 and dissipated Sept. 7.
- Made five separate landfalls three in the Bahamas, one in North Carolina and one in Nova Scotia.
- 50 deaths in the Bahamas.
- Five deaths in the U.S.
- 1,300 people still missing in the Bahamas


