

4 Things Philanthropy Can Do Now

- 1. Put equity first.
- 2. Give more.
- 3. Be flexible.
- 4. Move money quickly.





In practice, this means:

- Prioritize the visions of people of color, LGBTQ people, and those disproportionately affected by the pandemic
- **Fund movements** advocating for equitable policy responses from government (including c-4s if you can)
- Reduce or eliminate burdensome reporting and application requirements
- Persuade your peers to support equity, and insist that collaboratives you're part of take an equity-focused approach





Calls to action we are supporting:

- **Joint statement** calling for <u>increased giving</u>, including dipping into endowments
- Funder pledge for <u>flexibility</u>, <u>listening and a just emergency</u> <u>response</u>.


Key Takeaways


