



Pastoralism in Northern Kenya

- Kenya has the 3rd largest livestock population in sub-Saharan
 Africa
- 80% of the Kenyan Country landmass are Arid and Semi-Arid Lands (ASAL)
- Over 90% of Kenyan livestock are found in the ASALs
- Livestock contribute about 1/3 of the agriculture sector GDP which is also the largest single contributor to GDP
- 10% of livestock in the highlands of Kenya account for 54% of the livestock sector GDP
- Livestock in ASALs adopts free range production system drought tolerant species with low productivity
- It is believed that pastoralism in the Kenyan ASALs has been consistent for the past 4,000 years
- ASALs face the biggest brunt of climate change droughts, floods, violent conflict, population displacements, human and livestock diseases etc.



Impact of climate shocks on people and livestock



- Pastoralists lost between 30% 70% livestock between 2021 and early 2023 to the drought emergency
- Population displacement and emergence of pastoralist dropouts



- ➤ High levels of acute malnutrition (25% plus)
- Decreased access to water



- Increased levels of violent conflicts source of restocking
- Increased levels of extreme poverty and high dependency


